





# U.S. Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Signs Monumental MOUs with Blue Wave SDP and Hispanics in Energy

Santa Fe, New Mexico, May 2, 2022 – Last week, the United States Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (USHCC) signed two new Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) to grow the Chamber's partnerships with leading companies and organizations supporting Hispanic business growth in the U.S.

The agreement with Blue Wave International Supplier Development Platform looks to amplify the Chamber's product offering for Hispanic Business Enterprises (HBEs), while the understanding with the industry-focused non-profit, Hispanics In Energy (HIE), affirms the USHCC's commitment to supporting Hispanics and HBEs flourish within the energy sector.

Blue Wave is a leading, scalable, and bilingual automated supplier development platform. It is focused on transforming the supply chain landscape across all sectors by establishing alliances with large corporations, associations, and governments. #### Each MOU establishes the following:

- Blue Wave: The company will provide services for the Hispanic Supplier Development program, including the education, training, building capacity, and providing leadership development for HBEs associated with the USHCC Educational Fund. This dynamic service offering will be available to all 260 Hispanic Chambers of Commerce throughout the United States. Launching the first pilot HBE group by fall 2022.
- HIE: Both organizations will work to increase procurement opportunities by establishing metrics based on consumer demographics and potential growth of Hispanic-owned businesses, c-suite recruitment, and access to capital for HBEs and Hispanic professionals to further evolve in the energy sector.
